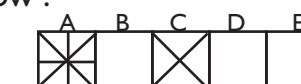

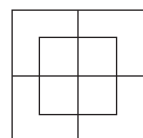
- The medium of examination is English.

- Make corrections, if any in the coding sheet as indicated below :



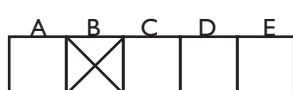
- No negative marks for wrong answers.
